**TRUSTEES' REPORT 2020-2021**

**1. The Objectives**

- (1) The advancement of the Christian Faith in accordance with the statement of Doctrines in the Trust Schedule and, in particular, by the provision of Christian literature in various media.
- (2) The promotion of any other charitable purpose for the benefit of the community of Mid and West Wales by the advancement of education, the protection of health and the relief of poverty and sickness as an expression of the Christian Faith.

**2. Strategies, Activities and Achievements in view of these Objectives**

**It has to be said at the outset that the following details have continued to be seriously affected by the lockdown resulting from the coronavirus outbreak. Everything was closed down on March 21<sup>st</sup> 2020, reopened in August 2020, but then closed for 5 months from December 21<sup>st</sup> 2020 until May 20<sup>th</sup> 2021. The Centre has now reopened but only for part of the week, awaiting a further relaxation of restrictions.**

The Centre has striven to keep all the above objectives in mind as it has worked through the year. **The general pattern – were it not for Covid restrictions - is as follows:**

- the Centre is open five days a week, closed on Sundays and Wednesdays (a Church Ladies' Meeting is held there on Wednesday mornings) between 10.00 a.m. and 4.00 p.m.; the staff always pray together before opening and after closing
- generally the footfall has steadied somewhat, in spite of restrictions; as before, from time to time we catered for groups/parties who arranged to come for lunch or tea on special occasions such as birthdays; we also catered for funeral teas and for special evening events; we were particularly busy in 2020 again with Christmas Dinners
- the Christian Bookstall and the Cwtsh (the area where a variety of other materials are available) have continued to be the focus of many visits, enquiries and sales; this service is enhanced by the substantial second-hand Christian books' service located on separate shelving; (sales from these areas during the last year, though regular, have experienced something of an upturn this year)
- we provide a free Wi-Fi service to customers
- our upstairs accommodation and other areas of the Centre have continued to be disrupted this year by the building of a church next door, Lampeter Evangelical Church (now open, though still not finally complete); this has been a major venture on behalf of Lampeter Evangelical Church with whom we have a close association; though we

are two independent charities, many of the church's trustees are also trustees of The Lampeter Christian Centre; a legal agreement has been drawn up by means of which access from one entity to the other is acknowledged, in order to facilitate co-operation in promoting the Gospel in the town and community

- the Centre continues to be regularly used by a variety of groups or societies during the daytime e.g. a Blythswood (Christian charity) Knitting Group supported by Lampeter Evangelical Church meets every month to provide for needy people in other countries, particularly the Eastern Europe countries, reading group, Knits and Natters, Beekeepers' Association, a men's group, a singing group, Alzheimer's Society, MS group, Bible Study groups, an epilepsy group, computer classes' groups, as well as other bodies, over 20 altogether
- the Centre is used quite regularly in the evening, outside of ordinary hours e.g. several church meetings are held (Bible Studies and Prayer Meetings, Missionary Meetings, Learning Welsh Courses, Church Business Meetings), Church events (such as the St. David's Day Cawl Evening), various groups who ask for food to be served, training and professional development events, Gideons International (now called Good News For Everyone) meetings, cookery demonstrations etc.; Christian Union students from the University of Wales Trinity Saint David at Lampeter are continuing to use *Yr Hedyn Mwstard* for some of their activities too, though this has measurably declined over the last couple of years
- staffing: there are still a good number of volunteers, including those with special needs, who contribute substantially to the workforce, but there are also a few individuals who are paid for their services: we now employ one full-time and three nearly full-time employees as well as other part-time individuals; four of the staff are on the pay-roll; **those on the payroll continue to be on the furlough scheme established by the Government in 2020, but are now working part of the week under flexible furlough arrangements**
- procedures for the safekeeping of foodstuff etc. are carefully adhered to, and the Centre has already received many different awards for its standards of food and hygiene; we are currently awarded a grade 5
- the Centre is closed for an extended period of time only between Christmas and the New Year, usually for approximately ten days; a general cleaning and maintenance programme is undertaken at this time; this is apart from the ongoing maintenance that arises as necessary from time to time; the general décor is important to maintain and is well respected and we envisage some work will have to be done in consequence of the church being built next door since it has meant new entrances being built for access between the two buildings; **we took advantage of the prolonged period of closure in 2020 to substantially refurbish the premises and the outside patio, and this has resulted in wide-ranging expressions of appreciation by customers**

- we try to maintain the building to the highest standards possible: there have been many improvements to certain aspects of its fabric during the year and all the necessary repairs have been carried out promptly
- we test the fire alarm system regularly
- the Trustees over the years have met for business meetings both formally and informally (these include regular financial reports) and once a year hold an A.G.M. **but these have unfortunately been badly affected by Covid restrictions during this last year;** minutes of these meetings are kept; the meetings keep eyes focussed on strategy (in line with the objectives) as well as giving attention to the operational everyday matters; the Trustees also meet monthly for Prayer Meetings
- twice a year, in March and September, consideration is focussed on giving to charities, whether they be local good causes or known international Christian organisations , or even individual Christians or people in need (e.g. we provide support one child's educational needs in a third world country through a Christian Charity); our financial position continues to be generally sound, but has continued to be under more pressure – though more encouraging at present in spite of the lockdown period – being the result as we see it of Government increases to the Basic Wage; **however our financial position this year has been healthier, since we have benefitted from various Government Grants as well as the furlough scheme; early on in the first lockdown we negotiated a loan of £10,000 but we are glad to report that this has now been fully repaid**
- in January 2017 we came on-stream with regard to workplace pensions enrolment; four members of staff have joined this scheme
- we are members of the Lampeter Chamber of Trade and get involved in all the various community events that they arrange throughout the year; this has allowed us to contribute and play our part fully this year again in the local community; meetings by means of Zoom and certain activities have continued in spite of the lockdowns
- the Centre works entirely bilingually, through the use of both Welsh and English languages.

### 3. Future Plans

Several issues have been discussed and will need further attention again this year:

- we still continue to ponder whether we should appoint a manager (from amongst our full-time/nearly full-time employees) who would further our attempts to meet the objectives delineated in our Charity Deed document; we have already given further responsibilities to some of those individuals in order to relieve Trustees and to make fuller use of employees' varied skills

- there would be an advantage in increasing again the number of Trustees, although we appointed two new Trustees in 2017, bringing the number of Trustees to six – this would further complement the skills and experience of the existing Board of Trustees
- the enhancement of Christian counselling and support
- continually improving the premises by means of further developments and possible refurbishments, renewal of equipment and the use of further strategies to reach out to people in the community; this will be a necessary element in the next few months or so as a result of the changes being made as a consequence of the new church building next door (see above.)

#### **4. Finances**

Great care is taken with accounts, but naturally finances – as suggested from the above arrangements and activities – are used to further the Centre's objectives.

The following comments need to be noted:

- regular use is made of a professional accountant to help with the Centre's financial obligations
- payment is made each year for the Centre accounts to be audited
- the Treasurer presents accounts regularly to members during the monthly Business Meetings and they are discussed openly and thoroughly
- we have a well-established website
- our card facility (debit and credit cards) introduced some years ago has undoubtedly enhanced the service provided by the Centre
- sums of money are sent to Christian charities and individuals every year, at local, national and international levels, including missionary work, as noted above.

#### **5. Conclusion**

**In view of the above, the Trustees would like to express their gratitude to the Officers of Lampeter Christian Centre for their faithful adherence to the terms of the Trust.**

**We are encouraged that the Centre continues to flourish and meets its responsibilities to bring the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the local community whilst also facilitating local and world-wide missionary movements and associations, charity groups and support for individuals. We are satisfied that the accounts have been kept to the highest standard and that all transactions have been carried out with the utmost integrity. Money has been prudently used to pursue effectively, efficiently and successfully the Centre's stated objectives.**

**We trust that the Centre will continue to know much blessing in the future and are very happy to endorse the vision that we as Trustees have to continue the strengthening of the cause of Jesus Christ.**
