In connection with my examination, no matter has come to my attention;



#### **1 Accounting Policies.**

## **STATEMENT OF RESERVE POLICY.**

In the late 1970's, it was necessary to consider rebuilding the Group Headquarters as it had become life expired, and lots of fund raising of all types ensued.

As a result, the new Headquarters was opened in 1982 with a life expectancy of about 40 years, taking it to 2020.

In 1982, the then committee decided to keep the slight surplus from the Building Fund as a Rebuilding / Heavy Maintenance Fund to help with future costs.

This fund is now invested with Barclays Premium Savings Account and needing 2 signatures for withdrawal, is for future rebuilding or, at the Group Committee's discretion, for major works such as replacing floors or roofing.

## **TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT FOR YEAR ENDING 31 MARCH 2022**

Although this has been another difficult year for everyone the group has had a successful year with membership numbers rising slightly. The leaders have tried to keep the children interested whilst keeping to Scout Association rulings.

Financially, although we have been unable to do any fundraising, we have been unexpectedly fortunate to receive money in the form of grants from the council, local businesses and parent donations, leaving us with a surplus of £13508.87

Hopefully some money to be spent on subsidising trips and camps for the children.

Unfortunately the camping trailer was stolen from the premises earlier this year. The insurance has been paid out and parents have made donations towards the cost of a new one. We hope to buy a new one as soon as possible although the price has gone up since we bought the original.
