Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS 31ST MARCH 2025

- 1 The Income from the investment in Schroder fund Decreased in the year from £35,431 to £30,168.
- 2 Grant made in the year amounted to £19,750 compared to £16,400 in 2024.
- 3 Expenses include accountancy charges of £650 (2024 : £624) for the current year.
- 4 The Surplus for the year is £36,654 (2024 Surplus : £36,330).
- 5 The value of the Schroder units as 31st March 2025 has Increased in the year by £24,618. The investment in AEGON has increased by £2,292 Overall, there is a Surplus on the value of investment held of £26,910.
- 6 The value of the overall fund is Stands at £889,691 (2024 : £853,037).
- 7 The total income of the fund continues to be sufficient to meet the current level of grants made by the chartiy and the grants in the last three years have all been met from the income form the funds held.
