These funds are deliberately maintained to ensure the charity can respond swiftly and effectively to unforeseen emergencies, such as natural disasters including earthquakes, floods, and other crisis situations. Maintaining this reserve enables us to provide timely humanitarian assistance when it is most urgently needed, ensuring our operational readiness in times of exceptional need.</p>

These reserves are maintained in line with our reserves policy, which aims to ensure the charity can respond promptly to emergency situations such as natural disasters. The trustees regularly review the reserve levels to ensure they remain appropriate to the charity's risk profile and operational needs.</p>


