We also provide members with bulletins three or four times per year giving details of our activities and providing information about the work of related bodies.</p> <p>Our website durhamcity.org also contains a great deal of current information.</p>

It is also represented on the Coordinating Committee of the Castle and Cathedral World Heritage Site.</p> <p>The Trust has co-sponsored with the Parish Council <i>The Durham City Heritage Trail</i>, a walking guide for the City's rich heritage which is freely available to residents and visitors.</p> <p>All these activities are designed both to raise the profile of the Trust and also to involve as many citizens as possible in issues that affect our historical and natural heritage.</p>
