They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF SHERBURN COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION

I report on the accounts of the Charity for the year ended 31 December 2023.
