YOUTH FOR CHRIST NORTH EAST ANNUAL TRUSTEES REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JULY 2020

The Executive Committee present their report along with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 July 2020. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out on page 9 and comply with the charity's constitution and applicable law.

Structure

Youth for Christ North East (YFCNE) is a registered charity (no. 504262) registered on 1 June 1967 and governed by a constitution dated 12 November 2002. The address of the principal office is Youth for Christ North East, The Allen, The Green, Wallsend, Newcastle upon Tyne, NE287NP. The names and addresses of the charity's bankers and auditors are stated on page 1. YFCNE is an affiliate member of British Youth for Christ (BYFC) and must comply with the chartering regulations adopted by BYFC.

Governance and management

The Executive Committee during the year comprised, Rev James Harvey, Mr Stephen Riley, Pastor Michael Duff, Mrs Aileen Innes and Pastor Julian Clark.

New Members of the Committee are appointed by unanimous agreement of the current members. Line Managers meet monthly with the Director and the Executive Committee meets bimonthly with the management to review policy, review performance against current goals and consider future plans. Management regarding current projects and activities makes day to day decisions but more strategic decisions relating to new projects and areas of major expenditure are taken to the Executive Committee.

As we move into the next financial year our we will see Mr Stephen Riley and Reverend James Harvey resign from the board.

The Trustees in carrying out their respective duties have at all times paid due regard to the Charity Commission guidance on Public Benefit Requirement as laid down out in section 4 of the Charities Act 2006.

Aims and objectives

Related Parties

YFCNE exists as part of British Youth for Christ (BYFC) however is totally independent with its own identity and separate strategy and stands financially detached from BYFC and is a registered charity in its own right.

Charitable Aims: Our Mission Statement is

"Taking the Good News relevantly to every young person in the North East of England"

We do this by creating and taking opportunities in the local area to embody the gospel of Jesus Christ, with and on behalf of the local church of our region, in ways that speak to and effectively engage local young people of this generation within the 8-25 age group (with a core focus on ages 11-18). By North East we include County Durham, Wearside and Teeside, but prioritise the area immediately around Tyneside and Northumberland.

To enable us to embrace our mission, the key strategic aims and objectives for the year were as follows:

Growing Leaders
Resourcing
Churches Equipping
Schools Gathering
Together

We will continue to embrace these priorities in seeking to be effective in taking good news relevantly to young people whilst also beginning to review what we do and where God is taking us through the lens of Youth for Christ's 4 D's of evangelism: Demonstration, Declaration, Decision, Disciple.

Growing leaders

One of our key objectives is to foster Christian leadership potential within young people from across the region. We continue to develop new initiatives, as well as running our existing programmes to help achieve these goals.

We run an internship programme, 'The Big Year Out', designed to provide an opportunity for young people to spend a year (after their A-Levels) working with us to gain valuable experience in both evangelism and outreach, as well as mentoring and development. The Big Year Out gives us the ability to provide focused development with key volunteers and interns with a view to seeing them grow in their gifting.

We are currently working with Churches to help them provide strong mentoring and development to inspire the young people they work with to grow in their leadership gifting and potential. We provide training and advice to Church leaders, as well as direct mentoring for Youth workers in how to develop leadership in young people. We are doing this directly and also in partnership with The 19 Project, a local leadership development programme ran by one of our Trustees.

Our staff team continue to meet regularly with a handful of young people to help encourage them in their growth. This has been highly effective, due to the relational methodology and one on one time.

Resourcing Churches

We have worked with a number of key ministry partners to help Churches reach and impact their local communities. We secured funding through Street Games to provide holiday activities to young people across the summer holidays as part of the 'fit and fed' initiative. Sessions involve using sport to help unpack Faith and Christian moral ethics to young people while helping families from communities with healthy food and activities. We have worked with approximately 100 young people across the city to deliver this provision.

Working with Cramlington Parish Church we have assisted in their 'Hot Chocolate Project' working with teenagers from across Northumberland in the local Church. This involved helping run a weekly drop in club where young people could attend, eat and hang out. This is a great way to meet young people without a Church background. These sessions are regularly attended by approximately 100 young people.

Our team continue to speak in Church and youth group settings across the region, in multiple Churches from a plethora of different denominations.

Equipping Schools

Over the past 12 months we have seen our schools based projects increase. We have two main schools programmes that we run which are the Xcel Course and Rock Solid.

Xcel is a mentoring course for a hand picked group of students, looking at excelling in Character, emotions and lifestyle. We currently run Xcel in 4 schools across the region a growth of 3 over the last year.

Rock Solid is our foundation of Faith Course and has now expanded into a further 2 schools in 2019/2020. This has become a popular lunchtime club in the schools that we work in.

Gathering Together

We continue to run a regional youth event named ASK 7:7. ASK 7:7 provides a corporate worship environment for young people across the region that is an important part of cross denominational links between young people in the region. ASK 7:7 is 'seeker friendly' driving an environment for both Church young people and those who aren't connected to a place of worship. ASK 7:7 is attended by approximately 200-250 people. We have seen over 80 young people make decisions of faith at these events in the past year. ASK 7:7 gives us a great platform to help shape youth culture in the region and give young people a strong, Christ-centred, positive message for their lives. ASK 7:7 runs at a loss of approximately £1,500 per event and grants and sponsorship have been important in making these events happen.

As in previous years, a number of the initiatives we a running overlap between our strategic priorities and this is very deliberate. Through 'Resourcing Churches' we want to be able to lead Churches in 'Equipping Schools', through 'Growing Leaders' we are seeing people 'Gathering Together' and this works across the board. Our main aim is "seeing young people's lives changed by Jesus" and this flows through all of the work that we do. We are seeing young people engaging with the Christian message, responding to the Gospel and growing in faith and this is happening in all of our 4 objectives. Finance

We have made some significant cost cutting advancements in the organisation to help us move to a stronger financial position. With key changes in our staff team and more flexibly based contracts we have been able to tailor our staffing to match the demand of our programme delivery. As well as this we have reviewed and adapted how we operate in terms of being reimbursed for the work we do. As well as the above we have continued to receive support from individual donors, as well as key corporate donors.

Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 July 2020

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Charities Act 2011.

The financial statements have been prepared to give a 'true and fair' view and have departed from the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 only to the extent required to provide a 'true and fair' view. This departure has involved following Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) rather than the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice which has since been withdrawn.

Income

Donations are generally accounted for when received by the Trust, including provision for any gift aid recoverable. Income from functions and projects is recognised as earned. Investment income is recognised on a receivable basis.

Voluntary assistance

Time is expended on the Charity's activities and governance which is donated free of charge. It is impractical to quantify the value of the time given, and accordingly it is neither recorded as donated income nor as an expense in the financial statements.

Taxation

As a registered Charity, the Trust is generally exempt from income tax and capital gains tax, but not from VAT. Irrecoverable VAT is included in the cost of those items to which it relates.

Restricted income

Donations and legacies for specific purposes are credited to restricted funds and expenditure for these purposes is charged to the funds.

1 Accounting policies (continued)

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation for motor vehicles is provided at 20% on a straight line basis. All other depreciation is provided at 25% on a straight line basis in order to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its estimated useful life.
