Trustees' Report

The Trustees present their Annual Report together with the financial statements and Independent Examiner's Report of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2023.

The charity's principal activity is the provision of Village Hall facilities for the benefit of the entire community in or around Fairfield. Activities include specific groups for the young and the old, the Parish Church, Women's Institute, and various local events.

Structure, Governance and Management

The Charity was created by a Trust Deed dated 30 December 1922.

Details of the Trustees who served throughout the year except as noted are included in the Reference and Administrative Details on page 2.

Objectives and Activities

Objects and Aims

The principal objects and aims of the charity are the operation of a successful, thriving village hall, for the public benefit, for the residents of Fairfield and surrounding areas.

Objectives and Activities

The Trustees oversee the management and activities held at the village hall and seek to ensure that the village hall provides a real benefit to the inhabitants of Fairfield and surrounding areas. The village hall is used by a broad cross section of residents ranging from the young attending Pre School to older residents attending regular social events such as various forms of dancing, martial arts classes, various club and society events and the local Women's Institute meetings. The hall also provides cinema facilities, screening a broad range of films and live streams on a regular basis and live music of various tastes, to suit the whole community.

Public Benefit

The Trustees have complied with the duty in section 4 of the Charities Act 2006 to have due regard to public benefit guidance published by the Charity Commission in defining the operational activities of the village hall. The activities by the charity to achieve public benefit are set out above.

Achievements and Performance

The year has seen income maintained at pre-pandemic levels with use of the Hall across all income streams. Expenditure has been increased to continue with a Programme of maintenance and upgrades. Hall finances have been managed to maintain an acceptable position to face the challenges presented and to preserve reserves for future contingency and planned upgrades in 2024.

Financial Position

The charity held bank balances 31 December 2023 of £37,385 compared with £37,587 in the previous year.

Reserves Policy

The Trustees review the reserve levels of the charity annually. This review encompasses the nature of income and expenditure streams, the need to match income with commitments and the nature of reserves.

The Trustees have determined that the appropriate level of free reserves should be approximately, £15,000. This is based on sufficient working capital to cover delays between spending and receipts and contingency for unexpected expenditure.
