1. During the year contributions were made for the relief of poverty, for human suffering due to persecution, war situations, natural disasters and in areas of famine. These needs were identified through global charity agencies. Contributions were channelled through The Unwana-Oro Christian Missionary Centre, Open Doors and Tear Fund. Locally in UK contributions were made to the Dundonald Food Bank and The Salvation Army.
2. Annual contributions were made to the Christian Medical Fellowship, The International Christian Medical and Dental Association and an annual donation to the Scripture Union working in schools Northern Ireland.
3. A number of contributions were made towards the advancement of Christianity both overseas and in Ireland. These included Mission Africa, The Bible Society, Crosslinks Ireland.
