Chairperson Introduction

We had a great start to the year with Siubhán Níc Amhlaoibh newly employed in her role as manager. This gave us an opportunity to rethink our plans. We began to be planning ahead again as we emerge from an unsettled period with Covid.

Unfortunately, we lost significant funding from the Education Authority which ended the Léargas programme, a program for teaching Irish that took place weekly in English schools, for the past 10 years. Due to this loss of funding, we have lost two valuable members of staff, John Dobbins and Sarah Coulhon. We were fortunate to be able to employ John as Administrator and Deputy Education Co-ordinator later in the year.

We still feel the important long-term implications of Covid on our audience and participants, but it important to recognise that the number of people attending classes is now rising again. economic challenges are affecting us greatly as our current costs are rising, our internal costs are rising and there exists increased competition for funding.

We welcomed Cara McLaughlin, Paul McIntyre and Brian Kelly. Each of these employees made a positive contribution to the team this year. We welcomed Sinéad Coyle to the board this year. We said goodbye to Páidrigín Ní Mhaonaigh and Gearóid Ó hEára from the board. They each brought with them distinct skills and considerable drive for several years. We thank them, and our sincere thanks goes out to Gearóid, who founded the organisation and was its director for more than thirty years.

All of our programs continued this year; over 400 learning Irish in Irish classes, and 300 learning traditional music in the Music Academy. We added to our program established social activities, with chat circles, quiz and bingo nights, and weekend activities for young people. We delivered another successful IMBOLC festival in which several concerts were sold out during the week. There was a very lively concert for children with KILA, and a fundraising night for Gaza, supported by many traditional musicians. This year we have seen increased interest in the classes in Waterside, which have been made available to those who do not have a traditional connection to the language. We also continue to engage with many community partners, and this creates great opportunities for us. Significant work has been done this year in partnership with various groups.

We were working with the Heritage Consortium led by the Foyle Civic Trust and funded by the National Lottery; through this we were fortunate to be able to increase our organisational skills in relation to the care to be given to our heritage buildings and that work will continue. Additional investment in our community came through the Community Wealth Building partnership, of which Siubhán is the vice chair. This group is working to ensure that the money made in Derry and the Northwest stays locally in the community, and that local people benefit from it.

We've worked hard to raise the income we need to keep our services going, and a special thank you goes out to our long-term funders and supporters - Foras na Gaeilge, The Arts Council, The Department of Foreign Affairs, The Community Relations Council, Derry City and Strabane District Council, and the Ultach Trust. This year we also received the news that 3-year funding from the Education Authority will be made available for Club Óige Setanta - our all-Irish youth club. This was a major achievement for the organisation as there are only 2 all-Irish clubs funded through this scheme. We would not be able to achieve our objectives without this ongoing support from the groups mentioned above.

Our Aims and Objectives

An Gaeláras Limited is a charity, which was established to promote the Irish language and Irish culture in the North West. The organisation's vision is to create a shared, bilingual community in the Northwest, invested in Irish culture in the broadest sense. We nurture the Irish language and Irish culture, connecting generations and communities, through education, celebration and creativity.

We have values that are important in the work we do, and these values are Empathy, Community, Appreciation, Gratitude and Integrity.

In order to contribute to the charitable goals of the organisation, this year, we undertook the following events:

Club Óige Setanta - an all-Irish youth club that meets the needs of young people with Irish - three nights a week.

We taught Irish to 400+ people, with 4x intensive courses, weekly classes and classes over the summer.

We taught music to 300+ people at the Music Academy.

We provided a social program in Irish, with ceilidhs, quizzes, trips to the Gaeltacht, multiple facilitated conversation circles, bingo nights etc.

Special events for children - such as weekly introductions to language and culture.

An arts program with concerts - a highlight is the IMBOLC festival in February and Féile le Chéile in September.

A cross-community project with Irish language classes for those who do not have a traditional connection to the language.

We continued to work with the joint group to build the wealth of the Derry community, and the joint heritage group to take proper care of our buildings.

The board and the team did a lot of work to put together a new strategy that will be the foundation of the organisation's work 24-27. The board and the director agreed on the 5 major goals for the coming years:

- Teaching Irish and traditional music through a range of formal and informal learning opportunities.
- To provide a broad artistic program, focusing on creating opportunities for education and creativity through the medium of Irish, and the traditional Irish arts, and to hold exhibitions of the best Irish and Irish artists.
- To provide an Irish youth club that provides language, culture and leadership opportunities, and links to the wider program of the Uí Chanáin Cultural Centre.
- Welcoming non-traditional learners to the Irish language and the arts, especially those with a broad Unionist background, and who are not traditionally associated with the Irish language, and to use the language to foster links between communities in Derry and the Northwest.

- Building a strong organisation, developing staff, managing human resources, physical resources, financial resources and practising the best governance.

Financial Review

Principal Funding Sources

The principal funding sources over the relevant financial year have been the Arts Council, Foras na Gaelige, Derry City and Strabane District Council, University of Ulster, Department of Foreign Affairs, The Community Relations Council and the Ultach Trust.

This year, our financial health faced challenges. Our main sources of revenue-grant and government funding - were impacted, leading to a deficit of £2,883 in the current year. To manage this, we took proactive measures to reduce operational costs, particularly in areas such as office expenses and building maintenance. However, core operational funding remains a concern, especially after the loss of support from the Department of Education. Despite these difficulties, we made key investments in new staging and instruments, thanks to grants from the Arts Council. We also received a notable anonymous donation, which helped stabilise our position. Our financial reserves are stable and continue to be assessed.

Achievements and Support

We would like to extend our heartfelt gratitude to all our supporters, community members, learners, and attendees of our activities for their unwavering commitment to our mission. The participation of our learners, attendees, and community partners in our Irish language classes, cultural events, and music programs keeps the heart of our organisation beating. We are deeply thankful to our dedicated team and board for their hard work and passion, which enables us to continue promoting the rich heritage of Irish culture and language.

We remain optimistic about the future and confident that, together, we will continue to make a lasting impact on the community, keeping the Irish language and cultural traditions alive and thriving. Go raibh míle maith agaibh!

Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 22 November 1999 and registered as a charity on 22 November 1999. The company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed by its Articles of Association.

Recruitment and Appointment of the Board of Directors

The directors of the company are also charity trustees for the purposes of charity law and under the company's Articles are known as members of the Board. Under the requirements of the Memorandum and Articles of Association, one third of the members of the Board must stand for re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

All members of the Board give their time voluntarily and receive no benefits from the charity.

Members Induction and Training.

Board members are already familiar with the work of An Gaeláras Limited. Board members are encouraged to participate in relevant activities.

Obligations of the Board

The main obligation of the Board is to develop and oversee the implementation of policy and to ensure that structures and management comply with legal requirements and good governance practice.

Risk Management

The Board has conducted a review of the major risks to which the charity is exposed. Where appropriate systems and procedures have been established to mitigate the risks. Internal control risks are minimised by the implementation of procedures for authorisation of all transactions and projects. A possible breach of confidentiality is an obvious risk. All Board members, staff and volunteers have signed the appropriate confidentiality agreements. Another major risk is loss of funding.

Organisational Structure

An Gaeláras has a Board which meets quarterly and is responsible for policy, strategic direction and overall performance. There are fortnightly staff meetings and a finance committee meets quarterly. The committee includes a Board Member, Treasurer, the Project Manager and the Administration/ Finance Officer.

The manager provides a quarterly and monthly report to the Board which includes a financial report and an update on project development.

Responsibilities of the Board of Directors

The directors are responsible for preparing the Director Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Practice).

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under company law the directors must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of the affairs of the charitable company at the Balance Sheet date and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP 2019 (FRS 102);
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is not appropriate to assume that the company will continue on that basis;

- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;

The directors are responsible for maintaining proper accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the charity's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. The directors are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Independent auditor's report to the directors of An Gaeláras Limited

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of An Gaeláras Limited for the year ended 31 March 2024 which comprise the Statement of Financial Activities, the Balance Sheet, Cashflow Statement and the related notes. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice) including FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland".

Responsibilities of the directors

As explained more fully in the Directors' Responsibilities Statement set out on page 4, the directors (who are also the directors of the charitable company for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements and for being satisfied that they give a true and fair view, and for such internal control as the directors determine is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, the directors are responsible for assessing the charitable company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the trustees either intend to liquidate the charitable company or to cease operations, or have no realistic alternative but to do so.

Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements

Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with ISAs (UK) will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

Explanation as to what extent the audit was considered capable of detecting irregularities, including fraud;

Irregularities, including fraud, are instances of non-compliance with laws and regulations. We design procedures in line with our responsibilities, outlined above, to detect material misstatements in respect of irregularities, including fraud. However, the primary responsibility for the prevention and detection of fraud lies with management and the board of directors of the charitable company.

Identifying and assessing potential risks related to irregularities

In identifying and assessing risks of material misstatement in respect of irregularities, including fraud and non-compliance with laws and regulations, we considered the following:

- the nature of the industry, sector and the specific control environment which it operates in;

- all matters discussed among the audit engagement team regarding how and where fraud could occur and the potential indicators of fraud.

As a result of these procedures, we considered the opportunities and incentives that may exist within the charity for fraud. The audit included assessing the procedures and evaluating the measurement of estimations. In common with all audits under ISAs (UK), we are also required to perform specific procedures to respond to the risk of management override.

We also required an understanding of the legal and regulatory frameworks applicable to the charity and considered that the most significant are the Companies Act 2006, SORP 2019 (FRS 102) and Charities Act (Northern Ireland) 2008.

Audit responses to risks identified

Our procedures to respond to risks identified included the following:

- reviewing the financial statement disclosures, testing the relevant documentation to assess compliance with the significant laws and regulations - those described as having a direct effect on the financial statements;
- enquiring with management and obtaining third party confirmation from the charitable company's solicitors regarding any actual or potential litigation and claims;
- performing analytical procedures to identify any unusual or unexpected relationships that may indicate risks of material misstatement due to fraud;
- reading minutes of board and management meetings, examine forecasting material in line with actual performance, identifying any potential fraud indicators or instances;
- reviewing Companies House and Charity Commission Northern Ireland correspondence, identify any late submissions or omissions of mandatory information;
- review correspondence with HMRC, identifying non compliance of specific information to be disclosed;
- in addressing the risk of fraud through management override of controls, testing the appropriateness of data entries and adjustments; assessing whether the judgements made in making accounting estimates are indicative of a potential bias; and evaluating the rationale of any significant transactions that are unusual or outside the normal course of the charities objectives.

We also communicated relevant identified laws and regulations and potential fraud risks to all engagement team members and remained alert to any indications of fraud or noncompliance with laws and regulations throughout the audit.

As part of an audit in accordance with ISAs (UK), we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional scepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.

1. General information

The charity is a private limited company by guarantee, registered in Northern Ireland and a registered charity in Northern Ireland. The address of the registered office in Cultúrlann Uí Chanáin, 37 Mórshráid Shémais, Doire, BT48 7DF. It is a registered charity with the Charity Commission Northern Ireland with effect from 16th May 2014.

1.1. Accounting convention

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below and have remained unchanged from the previous year, and also have been consistently applied within the same accounts.

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS102. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland Charities SORP issued in October 2019 and the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102), the Companies Act 2006 and the Charities Act (Northern Ireland) 2008 and UK Generally Accepted Accounting Practice.

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention, modified to include certain items at fair value. The financial statements are presented in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity.

1.2. Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Income from charitable activities includes both government and other grants received, they are recognised at fair value when the charity has entitlement after any performance conditions have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably. If entitlement is not met then these amounts are deferred. Capital and revenue grants are released to the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which they are received in line with the SORP Accounting & Reporting by Charities (FRS 102).

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the statement of financial activities when receivable. Grants where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.

Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included.

Gifts donated for resale are included as incoming resources within activities for generating funds when they are sold.

1.3. Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

1.4. Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the directors in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund.

1.5. Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost or valuation less residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Land and buildings	-	2% Straight Line
Equipment	-	10% Straight Line

1.6. Cash at bank

Cash at bank and cash equivalents are stated at cost at the financial year end.

1.7. Debtors & creditors

Debtors and creditors with no stated interest rate and receivable or payable within one year are recorded at transaction price. Any losses arising from impairment are recognised in expenditure.

1.8. Capital grants

Capital grants are received in respect of purchase of fixed assets a portion of which is released to the statement of financial activities in the year of receipt.

1.9. Pension costs

The pension costs charged in the financial statements represent the contributions payable by the charity during the year.

1.10. Taxation

The company is a charity and is recognised as such by HM Revenue & Customs. As a result, there is no liability to taxation on any of its income.

1.11. Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within current liabilities.

1.12. Foreign currency

Foreign currency transactions are initially recognised by applying to the foreign currency amount the spot exchange rate between the functional currency and the foreign currency at the date of the transaction. Fixed asset investments are stated at cost less provision for diminution in value.

1.13. Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis as the directors believe that no material uncertainties exist. The directors have considered the level of funds held and the expected level of income and expenditure for 12 months from authorising these financial statements. The budgeted income and expenditure are sufficient with the level of reserves for the charity to be able to continue as a going concern.

1.14. Critical accounting estimates and judgements

In application of the charity's accounting policies, the directors are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amount of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised where the revision affects on that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods where the revision affects both current and future periods.
