for the financial year ended 31 December 2022

The trustees present their Trustees' Report and the audited financial statements for the financial year ended 31 December 2022.

The trustees are responsible for preparing the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

The law applicable to charities in Northern Ireland requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the assets, liabilities and financial position of the company as at the financial year end date and of the surplus or deficit of the company and otherwise comply with the Charities Act (Northern Ireland) 2008.

In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether the financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the relevant financial reporting framework, identify those standards, and note the effect and the reasons for any material departure from those standards; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in operation.

The trustees confirm that they have complied with the above requirements in preparing the financial statements.

The trustees are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act (Northern Ireland) 2008. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Structure, Governance and Management

Structure

The charity is unincorporated organisation governed by its Deed of Trust. The charity is recognised as a charity in Northern Ireland under the reference NIC100252. In the event of the organisation being wound up members will be required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1 each. The charity is under the control of the trustees.

Review of Activities, Achievements and Performance

The Evangelical Presbyterian Church (EPC) is established for the advancement of the Christian religion by supporting the work and outreach of its member churches and fellowships in Northern Ireland and selected Churches around the world.

The year saw a welcome return of normality to denominational church life following COVID 19. This included the recommencement of the church planting work in the Foyle area, regular in-person Presbytery meetings (seven in total), visits to other denominational bodies, including the General Assembly of the Orthodox Presbyterian Church in USA in June and the Presbytery Day conference back in its traditional mid-May slot. A new elder was elected in the Knock congregation.

Due to declining attendances, at its September meeting Presbytery formally, but reluctantly, agreed to close the work in Richhill. In October, Presbytery began the process leading to revised procedures for the election of elders across the denomination.

A four week leadership training course commenced in October.

Presbytery sought and obtained a sponsor licence from the Home Office for the engagement of individuals from abroad on time-limited placement to support the work in congregations. Accounts and annual reports on all aspects of denominational business were considered and approved as appropriate. Protection of Children and Vulnerable Adults (POCVA) training was arranged and delivered, as was First Aid Training.

Public Benefit

In setting our objectives and planning our activities for the year the trustees have given careful consideration to the Charity Commission for Northern Ireland's guidance on public benefit to ensure that the activities have helped to achieve the charity's purposes and provide a benefit to the beneficiaries. The benefits of our organisation are evidenced through informal and ad-hoc feedback from our members, their families, parents of the young people who

attend our youth meetings, and the wider public. We believe that no harm can come from the purpose of the charity. The only private benefit flowing from our purpose is related to the employment of our Ministers who receive benefits as a result of their employment. However, this is incidental and necessary in order to further our advancement of religion charitable purpose. There are no other private benefits, as all of our activities are open to the general public and advertised to them. Our beneficiaries include our members, their families, and the community in which we minister

Financial Review

The results for the financial year are set out on page and additional notes are provided showing income and expenditure in greater detail.

Reserves policy

The trustees continue to monitor and update their reserves policy in order to establish the level of reserves that are required to continue with our aims and objectives in future years.

Results and Dividends

At the end of the financial year the company has assets of £1,755,709 (2021 - £1,763,645) and liabilities of £45,935 (2021 - £67,202). The net assets of the company have increased by £13,331.

In accordance with the Deed of Trust, the trustees retire by rotation and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election.

Compliance with Sector-Wide Legislation and Standards

The company engages pro-actively with legislation, standards and codes which are developed for the sector. Evangelical Presbyterian Church subscribes to and is compliant with the following:

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

to the Members of Evangelical Presbyterian Church

Report on the audit of the financial statements

Opinion

We have audited the company financial statements of Evangelical Presbyterian Church ('the company') for the financial year ended 31 December 2022 which comprise the Statement of Financial Activities, the Balance Sheet, the Statement of Cash Flows and notes to the financial statements, including the summary of significant accounting policies set out in note 2. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards, including FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with FRS 102.

In our opinion, when reporting in accordance with a fair presentation framework the financial statements:

- give a true and fair view of the state of the company's affairs as at 31 December 2022 and of its surplus for the financial year then ended;
- have been properly prepared in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice; and
- have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Charities Act (Northern Ireland) 2008.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (UK) (ISAs (UK)) and applicable law. NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

for the financial year ended 31 December 2022

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

Evangelical Presbyterian Church is a charity incorporated in Northern Ireland. The registered office of the company is 16 Huntingdale, Ballyclare, Co. Antrim, BT39 9XB, Northern Ireland which is also the principal place of business of the company. The financial statements have been presented in Pound (£) which is also the functional currency of the company.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the charity's financial statements.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis under the historical cost convention, modified to include certain items at fair value. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland FRS 102".

As permitted by the Companies Act 2006, the company has varied the standard formats in that act for the Statement of Financial Activities and the Balance Sheet. Departures from the standard formats are to comply with the requirements of the Charities SORP and are in compliance with section 4.7, 10.6 and 15.2 of that SORP.

Statement of compliance

The financial statements of the company for the financial year ended 31 December 2017 have been prepared on the going concern basis and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland FRS 102".

Incoming Resources

Voluntary income or capital is included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the company is legally entitled to it, its financial value can be quantified with reasonable certainty and there is reasonable certainty of its ultimate receipt. Entitlement to legacies is considered established when the company has been notified of a distribution to be made by the executors. Income received in advance of due performance under a contract is accounted for as deferred income until earned. Grants for activities are recognised as income when the related conditions for legal entitlement have been met. All other income is accounted for on an accruals basis.

Resources Expended

All resources expended are accounted for on an accruals basis. Charitable activities include costs of services and grants, support costs and depreciation on related assets. Costs of generating funds similarly include fundraising activities. Non-staff costs not attributed to one category of activity are allocated or apportioned pro-rata to the staffing of the relevant service. Finance, HR, IT and administrative staff costs are directly attributable to individual activities by objective. Governance costs are those associated with constitutional and statutory requirements.

Investments

Investments held as fixed assets are stated at cost less provision for any permanent diminution in value. Income from other financial fixed asset investments together with any related tax credit is recognised in the profit and loss account in the year in which it is receivable.

Debtors

Debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due after any discount offered. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid net of any trade discounts due. Income recognised by the company from government agencies and other co-funders, but not yet received at year end, is included in debtors.

Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and in hand comprises cash on deposit at banks requiring less than three months notice of withdrawal.

Taxation

No current or deferred taxation arises as the company has been granted charitable exemption. Irrecoverable valued added tax is expensed as incurred.
