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DIRECTORS' REPORT

for the financial year ended 28 February 2025

The directors present their report and the unaudited financial statements for the financial year ended 28 February 2025.

Principal Activity

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee. The company does not have a share capital and consequently the liability of members is limited, subject to an undertaking by each member to contribute to the net assets or liabilities of the company on winding up such amounts as may be required not exceeding one pound (£1).

The principal activity of the company is that of the promotion of the cultural heritage of Ulster, particularly the music of the province, its history and culture. The company has established a Cultural Heritage Centre for locals and visitors to the region. The facilities provided include an exhibition centre, display hall, recording facilities and a licensed bar. The company is a registered charity (reference no: NIC100667)

The company is limited by guarantee not having a share capital.

Principal Risks and Uncertainties

There are a number of factors which may materially and adversely affect our ability to achieve our objectives. These risks include:

- Threat of competitors
- Changes in external operating environment
- Loss of funding
- Changes in customer buying behavior

The organisation has adopted controls necessary to manage these risks and enable efficient execution of the company's business model. A risk management strategy in place which is reviewed and updated at each board meeting and a risk register has been established.

Financial Results

The surplus/(deficit) for the financial year after providing for depreciation amounted to £695 (2024 - £(32,411)).

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

for the financial year ended 28 February 2025

1. General Information

Dún Úladh Limited is a company limited by guarantee incorporated in Northern Ireland. Cultural Heritage Centre of Ulster, Drumnakilly Road, Omagh, Co. Tyrone, BT79 0JP, Ireland is the registered office, which is also the principal place of business of the company. The nature of the company's operations and its principal activities are set out in the Directors' Report. The financial statements have been presented in Pound (£) which is also the functional currency of the company.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements.

Statement of compliance

The financial statements of the company for the year ended 28 February 2025 have been prepared in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and the Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued by the Financial Reporting Council and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis and in accordance with the historical cost convention except for certain properties and financial instruments that are measured at revalued amounts or fair values, as explained in the accounting policies below. Historical cost is generally based on the fair value of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

Income

Turnover comprises the invoice value of goods supplied and services rendered by the company, exclusive of trade discounts and value added tax.

Tangible assets and depreciation

Tangible assets are stated at cost or at valuation, less accumulated depreciation. The charge to depreciation is calculated to write off the original cost or valuation of tangible assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives as follows:

Land and buildings freehold	-	Over the life of Asset
Plant and machinery	-	20% straight line
Fixtures, fittings and equipment	-	20% straight line

The carrying values of tangible fixed assets are reviewed annually for impairment in periods if events or changes in circumstances indicate the carrying value may not be recoverable.

Trade and other debtors

Trade and other debtors are initially recognised at fair value and thereafter stated at amortised cost using the effective interest method less impairment losses for bad and doubtful debts except where the effect of discounting would be immaterial. In such cases the receivables are stated at cost less impairment losses for bad and doubtful debts.

Trade and other creditors

Trade and other creditors are initially recognised at fair value and thereafter stated at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method, unless the effect of discounting would be immaterial, in which case they are stated at cost.

Taxation

The company is a registered charity (reference no: NIC100667) and is therefore exempt from corporation tax.

Long Term Creditors

Capital grants received and receivable are treated as deferred income and amortised to the Income Statement annually over the useful economic life of the asset to which it relates. Revenue grants are credited to the Income Statement when received.

Foreign currencies

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the rates of exchange ruling at the Statement of Financial Position date. Non-monetary items that are measured in terms of historical cost in a foreign currency are translated at the rates of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Non-monetary items that are measured at fair value in a foreign currency are translated using the exchange rates at the date when the fair value was determined. The resulting exchange differences are dealt with in the Income Statement.

3. Significant accounting judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

GOING CONCERN

The directors have prepared budgets and cash flows for a period of at least twelve months from the date of the approval of the financial statements which demonstrate that there is no material uncertainty regarding the company's ability to meet its liabilities as they fall due, and to continue as a going concern. On this basis the directors consider it appropriate to prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis. Accordingly, these financial statements do not include any adjustments to the carrying amounts and classification of assets and liabilities that may arise if the company was unable to continue as a going concern. Given the current economic resources of the company, in addition to detailed projections and forecasts, the directors have concluded that the company will continue in existence for a period of 12 months post financial statements sign-off. These projections and forecasts were constructed using up to date financial information and conservative realistic assumptions derived from the directors' cumulative knowledge and experience.

4. Employees
