#### **Objectives and Activities**

The charity's objectives are:

- to develop effective relationships with staff, parents and others associated with the school.
- to engage in activities and provide facilities and equipment which support the school and advance the education of the pupils.
- to provide the means for all pupils of the school to avail of extra curricular activities thus promoting positive education, health and wellbeing benefits.

The charity's activities are:

The charity is managed by an executive committee consisting of all appointed trustees. The selection and appointment of new trustees is dealt with by the committee.


### **Financial Review**
