Our facilities continue to be used on an ongoing basis for cross community work however there have been refurbishment costs which we have had to contribute to this year.



We held our annual summer camp in August which was a huge success in terms of bringing young people together from the local area and we were also involved in a Peace IV ran by Crewe United and also a Community Good Relations Programme held by the club.

We hope to expand our community work in 2020 and seeking new funding streams is important for the organisation.
