Trustees Report

The trustees present the annual report and statements of Receipts and Payments, and Assets and Liabilities for Corcraín Redmanville Community Partnership for the year ended 31 March 2020.

Objects of the Charity

The objectives of Corcraín Redmanville Community Partnership (CRCP) are to provide facilities for the benefit of the inhabitants of the Corcraín and Redmanville area without distinction of age, sex, race, political, religious or other opinions by associating with the statutory authorities, voluntary organisations, youth organisations and inhabitants, in a common effort to advance education, protect health and provide facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure-time occupation, with the object of improving conditions of life for the said inhabitants and in particular

- To support the development of a cohesive, shared and integrated community and promote the wellbeing of those living in the area of benefit through the provision of educational, social and recreational activities

- To relieve those in need by reason of youth, age, ill health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage by providing them with information, representation, and advocacy with issues such as housing, community safety, the environment and community relations;
- Recruit and train volunteers with relevant skills to carry out the objects of the CRCP;
- Promote and organise co-operation in the achievement of the above objects and to that end to work in CRCP with local authorities and voluntary organisations engaged in the furtherance of the above objects in the area of benefit;

Activities of the Charity

The Corcraín and Redmanville Community Partnership has made a significant contribution to improving the lives and conditions in the area by providing facilities and services for the people of the area. The group offers several weekly programmes to target education, health and recreation and community cohesion. These programmes include Community Café, Y-zone after schools club and Numerous Classes such as crafts, Health awareness and low-risk exercise CRCP also represents residents in the area on various inter agency forums. It also offers seasonal gardening projects for inhabitants of all ages and is working closely with the Woodlands Trust to set up a "Friends of the Woodland" group. CRCP have also piloted a successful maintenance Programme proving street cleans, gardening, community DIY/Maintenance. Added to this, there are several events organized throughout the year to promote community spirit within the area including Easter events, Halloween Event and Christmas outings.

The group have moved into new larger premises to enable more activity throughout the growing community.

Achievements, Performance & Public Benefit

The activities outlined above demonstrate how CRCP continues to implement its charitable purposes.

Benefits to members of the public include:

- Increased opportunities for residents to meet and reduce social isolation Regeneration of infrastructure (development of Woodland area)
- A more connected and safer community
- Increased opportunities to volunteer and engage in community activities
- Personal development of the young people
- Improved life outcomes for young people

CRCP has mitigated any potential harm from the activities through child protection training, AccessNI checks, other relevant training, insurance cover and observance of good practice

Financial Review

The principal source of income of CRCP continues to be from Donations and Grants. The principal expense of CRCP is in respect of payments regarding general running and activity costs.

- CRCP opening balance for financial year 20/21 is £386.08
- CRCP continues to be in a healthy financial state as at 5th April 2021 with a closing account balance of £2,864

CRCP aims to retain enough reserves to meet its expected future expenditure requirements as well as potential future capital projects

Structure, Governance and Management Going Concern

The trustees have reviewed its planned expenditure for the year ahead and are satisfied that there are adequate funds in place to ensure that the Charity can continue its activities and the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2021 can be signed off as a going concern.

Corcraín Redmanville Community Partnership is a registered charity and is governed by the terms of its constitution, which was formally adapted on 3rd September 2003

Compliance with Public Benefit
