Objectives and Activities

Objectives

Kesh Senior Citizens Club – The Evergreens is established to promote the benefit of senior citizens and general community of the Kesh district of Co. Fermanagh its environs (hereinafter called the 'area of benefit') without distinction of gender, sexuality, nationality, ethnic origin, political, religious or other opinion, by associating the statutory authorities, voluntary organizations and inhabitants in a common effort to promote environmental issues, education, training, advice and information within the area of benefit, and to provide facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation.

Key Activities in this Year

Kesh Senior Citizens Club – The Evergreens have 53 members who meet monthly for a general meeting for ten months of the year usually at Kesh Community Centre and participate in a range of social, recreational and educational activities. Examples of activities have included 'Walking for Health' Programme, Boccia, Luncheon Club, Chair exercises, Health Fair, Information Talks, Tea Dances, Easter Party, Summer Outings.

The Club also regularly visit other Senior Citizens Clubs and take part in collective activities organised by other bodies such as South West Age Partnership. The club also host members of other Club's at events in Kesh.

Kesh Senior Citizens Club – The Evergreens Trustees have considered Charity Commission for Northern Ireland's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing our objectives and in planning our future activities to ensure that these achieve the club's purposes and provide a benefit to beneficiaries.

Financial Review

Review of Business

Kesh Senior Citizens Club – The Evergreens is non-profit making with net income and resources in this year of £7602.18

The trustees continue to manage resources in an efficient and sustainable manner.

Reserves Policy

Kesh Senior Citizens Club – The Evergreens have a Reserves Policy, which requires that reserves be built or maintained at a level which ensures that the clubs core activities could continue during a period of unforeseen difficulty and that the clubs known liabilities will be paid should the organisation cease to trade.

Future Plans

Kesh Senior Citizens Club – The Evergreens plan to continue to focus on controlling costs, while maintaining the high standards of service to our beneficiaries.
