PURPOSES

Crossdernott Bowling Club aims to promote the benefit of the people of the rural areas of Pomeroy and Donaghmore villages and the surrounding hinterland within the Mid Ulster Council areas of Cookstown and Dungannon, without distinction of sex, race, political, religious or other opinion, by associating the statutory authorities, voluntary organisations, community organisations and inhabitants in a common effort to advance education, and to provide facilities for recreation or other leisure-time occupation, with the object of improving the conditions of life for the said inhabitants.

PUBLIC BENEFITS

The charity's beneficiaries are primarily the adults and some young people who are all living in and around the Cookstown and Dungannon areas of Mid Ulster District and (especially the villages of Donaghmore and Pomeroy), who have been identified as being isolated and/or socially excluded. The club offers a welcoming environment for people of all age groups to meet and take part in a leisure activity which has both mental and social benefits to the rural community. Our own trustees who are our bowlers, receive information, services and activities in the same way as other beneficiaries, and are assigned support, information and services.

ACTIVITIES

During the year 1 April 2022 – 31 March 2023 Crossdernott Bowling Club members played home and away games in South Tyrone Indoor Bowling League Section A. These games were played from October to the end of February 2023. Some members also played in 8 player cup games. Preparations were made to continue the Annual Easter Tournament during Easter week 2023.
