Day to day responsibility for the running of the charity is delegated to the Liam Gordon. The Trustees meet four times a year to review strategy and financial performance.

The beneficiaries of all of the purposes are people in social and charitable need in Belfast and wider Northern Ireland area.

The benefits can all be demonstrated by feedback from beneficiaries following surveys. There is no potential for any harm and there is no private benefit in relation to any of the purposes. Objectives and activities LIFEREACH NI promotes a range of community capacity building programmes and projects for the benefit of the inhabitants within the area of benefit who have need of such assistance as a result of their youth, age, disability or infirmity, or social and economic circumstances, in an effort to increase the abilities, life skills and self-confidence of such communities in the area of benefit The trustees' report was approved by the Board of Trustees.
