Objectives

The club was established to promote the game of bowls in Gransha and the wider Enniskillen area. Without distinction of age, sex, race, political, religious or other opinion. Key Activities in this Year

Gransha Bowling Club has 20 members who have used the facilities of Gransha Hall in County Fermanagh for a weekly game of indoor bowls for ten months of the year. The club have also organised an annual bowling tournament for visiting clubs in Gransha Hall.


The Trustees are responsible for preparing the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.
