The relief of those in need by reason of youth, age, ill-health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage. Specifically, those who suffer from hearing loss, and its consequences for social interaction

4. Trustee Appointments

- i. All members are eligible for appointment to the management committee, and all members of the committee are trustees.

5. Our Charity's main activities to further our purposes for the Public Benefit are as follows: -

- i. Provision of social and informative meetings from September to May, usually held in Ballymena.
- ii. Provision of weekly Lip-Reading classes with a qualified ATLA Tutor in Ballymena on Saturday mornings from September to June.
- iii. Organising and providing transport for one full day social outing during the summer months although it was not possible to arrange one in 2022.
- iv. Advertising the activities in public areas such as Audiology Clinics, (Hospital and Private) Community Centres, Doctor's Surgeries, and other public spaces, as well as personal contacts.

- ii. Total Expenditure: 1907.77


8. Payments to Trustees
