Structure, Governance and Management

The trustees have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice [SORP] "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in 2005 in preparing the report and financial statements of the charity. They have also had regard for any other information required by law or the charity's governing document.

Governing Document

Tassagh Cultural Rural Neighbourhood Group is constituted as a charity under a trust deed dated 17 January 2006 and is recognised by The Charity Commission for Northern Ireland (Reference Number NIC 103662).

Objectives and Achievements

To provide a meeting place for the beneficiaries in the area to come to, and avail of, the classes and events, in education, health, recreation, cultural awareness and heritage, folklore and much more. We aim to provide a safe health environment for the environs. We promote rural development and cultural awareness in the area of benefit.

Achievements and Performance

Financial Review

Responsibilities of the Trustees

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards [United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice].

- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity. The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.
