The charity is an unincorporated association established under a constitution.

In fulfilling the public benefit requirement, the charity trustees have had regard to the Charity Commission for Northern Ireland's statutory public benefit guidance.

The purpose of the charity

To promote the benefits of the residents of Magheraveely and the local area, without distinction of age, sex, race, political, religious or other opinion, by associating the statutory authorities, voluntary organisations and inhabitants in a common effect to provide facilities in the interests of social welfare, for recreation and other leisure time occupation, with the object of improving the conditions of life for the said residents.

The information below sets out the activities we have carried out to further our purposes and fulfill the public benefit elements during the previous 12 months.

Activities

Our annual events, such as Christmas events, village clean up, tractor run and fare day, pub quizzes have continued this year and have been well supported by the community.

We have also been able to increase the number of classes such as yoga, art, flower arranging, and other health and well being events. The summer scheme for the youth has been a great success with all events well supported.

Our premises have been widely used by other community groups which we have supported such as the sunshine club and the football club.

The village has been kept tidy and small improvements take place such as painting of the bus shelter and children's art on display.

The group have also extended their role in the wider community by being involved in the redevelopment of Killyfole lough and in looking to make use of premises there.

We are again very grateful to Fermanagh and Omagh district council who have provided help, advice and funding. Also to other statutory and charitable groups who have provided funding.

Finances

A review of the charity's financial position confirms that the group is functioning within its financial means. The accounts have been compiled and examined to comply with the requirements of the Charity Commission for Northern Ireland.

In addition to funding received the charity does request a fair contribution from users which provides an income. This money is used for other running costs and within the community to achieve our purpose.
