

## Finance : Income and Expenditure

The Society has three main sources of income :

- Membership Subscriptions
- Profits from the annual public Plant Sale
- Individual payments, by participants, for garden visits, coach trips and meals

In the 2021/22 year, the Society made a surplus of £ 1,553

The Society is currently self-financing and does not receive any public or Local Authority Grants.

## Charitable Status

As a registered Charity, the Trustees of Bangor Horticultural Society are aware of its **'Education'** charitable status and consider that the programme of Events, Talks, Visits and provision of help and information to both its members and the general public, adequately fulfil its **'Education'** criteria.
