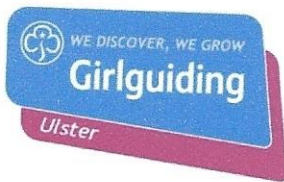

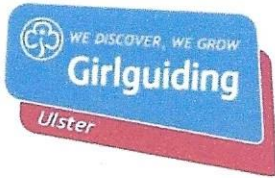
Craft, games, indoor camp, mini pizza night, 'Stormont Stroll', Santa Visit and experiencing outdoor activities and badges.
