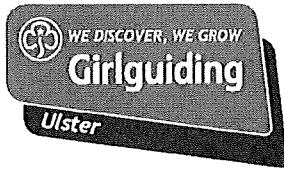

A summary of the Charity's main activities to further its purposes for the public benefit and the main achievements in the year

The unit had 14 members in 2022.

The term ended with a Jubilee celebration party.

Brownies returned in Sep working on the Adventures in the dark challenge badge which included activities such as Rocket making.

The year ended with a fundraiser, Christmas craft and a Christmas party.
