

The Management Committee present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31st March 2025.

Objectives and activities

The objectives of the charity are to: promote the health and well-being of the residents of the area and work together as residents regardless of age, ethnic origin, ability, sex, belief or political affiliation recognising the value of our many differences. We will involve local people to improve our area, carry out and promote both environmental and practical conservation, to educate, encourage, and support the local population in environmental practice by working with statutory and non-statutory agencies.

The charity aims to improve the green space generally known as Springhill Park and develop community initiatives to improve the social housing, health and well-being of it's residents.

The charity also seeks to engage youth and help local children build their confidence through gaining new skills and taking part in public activities.

The main activities are: afterschool's facilities, 4 sessions per week, women's group, senior sessions held 3 times per week. In addition: the group holds events for children i.e.. St Patrick's Day, Easter, Halloween, Christmas and a Summer Scheme lasting 4 weeks.
