Purpose of Charity as listed on Register of Charities

The Church acknowledges the headship and ultimate authority of Jesus Christ over His Church and exists to glorify the triune God by maintaining and promoting His worship both individually and corporately. Its members devote themselves to the teachings of Scripture, to fellowship, breaking of bread, prayer and evangelism. They commit, with the help of God, to witness to the saving and sustaining power of the Lord Jesus Christ and to work for the extension of His Kingdom. The principal charitable object of the church is the advancement of the Christian faith according to the teachings of Scripture, the Doctrinal Statement and Baptist principles.

Main activities to further its purpose for the public benefit

The main activities were sharing the gospel in the public domain, whether through activities in the church building or outside; Bible teaching resulting in people living Christianly and the demonstration of care, often practical, in the community designed to impact people and society. Help was offered those who find themselves in need, be that practical, emotional or spiritual. Services of worship for all ages; activities for children of primary school age; gatherings for mothers with pre-school children; meetings for senior citizens and events for teenagers and young adults all reflected the varied church programme designed to further the charities' purpose for the public benefit.

Main achievements during the year

Opportunities provided for people to engage in public worship and listen to the presentation of the Christian gospel which brings salvation were two of the Charities' main achievements. Public worship brought mutual encouragement, edification, spiritual development, moral understanding and growth as people gathered to focus on God and listened to the Scriptures being explained, thereby gaining an

understanding of Christian belief. Two other major benefits were loving God first of all and, flowing from that, love for others.

Other achievements in evidence were personal growth in holiness, help for those struggling with life issues, comfort to the bereaved, encouragement for the ill and elderly, and practical, financial and prayerful support for the Departments of the Association of Baptist Churches in Ireland as well as for missionary endeavours.

Review of the Charities' financial position at 31 December

The end of year balance was £45,495.

There were no funds held by the Charity that were materially in debt at the end of the year.
