

Killicomaine Baptist Church Trustee's Report

The trustees present their report and Receipts and Payment account for the year ended 31 December 2024.

Objectives and activities

Killicomaine Baptist Church ("the Church") acknowledges the headship of Jesus Christ over his Church and exists to glorify the Triune God by maintaining and promoting his worship both individually and corporately.

The principal charitable object of the Church is the advancement of the Christian faith according to the teaching of Scripture, understood in its historical and evangelical sense, the Doctrinal Statement and Baptist principles. Its members devote themselves to the teaching of Scripture, to fellowship, breaking of bread, prayer and evangelism.

The activities carried out by the Church include:

- holding regular services for public worship, prayer, Bible study, preaching and teaching for all age groups;
- providing pastoral care to the members of the church through visitation and prayer;
- organising meetings and events that promote our charitable purpose;
- participating in the life of the local community;
- supporting other Christian organisations and charities through volunteering, financial gifts and prayer.

The trustees have paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the church should undertake.

Achievements and performance

The Church meets the public benefit requirement by providing benefit to its members and the general public by making known the Christian gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ through the advancement of Christian faith. The Church provides weekly Sunday services offering opportunity for prayer, Bible teaching and worship through the singing of hymns and the hearing of God's Word as well as participating in the Lord's Supper.

The Church continued to provide benefit to its members and the public by making known the Christian Gospel and thus offering reconciliation with God to all who hear and respond. The Church offers the opportunity to meet in various groups throughout the year to give opportunity for those who attend to live, practise and grow their Christian faith. In this past year we have had an updated Fire and Risk Assessment completed and got training done for 10 fire wardens. Plans have also been submitted and passed for a new storage room and an upgraded fire escape landing and steps and this work is scheduled to commence next year.

Monthly events are held to promote a wider understanding of our Christian faith and these include Ladies Meetings, Men's Fellowship, monthly Missionary Meetings and special Prayer times. On the last Saturday of each month the Church holds an open-air meeting in Portadown where the Gospel is preached and tracts are distributed. This past year we also held open air meetings in our car park during the summer months which included guest singers and testimonies.

Primary school aged children are cared for in a variety of events in our Sunday School program engaging in crafts, games and lessons from the Bible. On Friday evenings the Church operates a Youth Club which engages with children and youth from the neighbouring community.

The Romanian Christian fellowship meets on the Church premises on a bi-weekly basis.


